## Adult Impact Questions November 19, 2017

If possible, read the book of I Peter 4:12-19 from several translations. For additional insight and study go to <a href="https://www.studylight.org">www.studylight.org</a>.

- 1. In verse 12 believers are told not to be "surprised" when mistreated by an unbeliever? Why might it be surprising to be mistreated as a Christian?
- 2. According to verse 13, why should Christians rejoice in suffering? How can that be a testimony to a non-Christian? (Consider I Peter 2:12; 3:16)
- 3. We learned from I Peter 3:14-22 that those who "suffer for what is right" are blessed. In 4:14 Peter why are those who "are insulted because of the name of Christ" considered blessed. What does it mean to suffer "because of the name of Christ"?
- 4. What does verse 14 mean when it says that when you suffer because of the name "the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you? (See Matthew 10:17-20; Acts 7:51-60; II Corinthians 3:15-18)
- 5. Peter says in verse 15 that there is no glory in suffering as a "criminal" or "meddler". What principles help you proclaim Jesus in word and deed without becoming a meddler? (See Galatians 6:1-5; I Peter 2:12-13; 17-18; 3:1, 15)
- 6. What do you learn about the last judgment from vs. 17-18? What does it mean to entrust yourselves to a "faithful Creator"? In light of this passage what does it mean to "continue to do good"? (See Matthew 5:16; Galatians 6:9-10)
