If possible, read II Peter 2:5 and Genesis 6:8-7:16; 8:1-22 from several translations. For additional insight and study go to www.studyLight.org.

1. According to the Genesis account, why did God spare Noah and his family?

What does it mean that he was righteous and walked with God?

Discuss how he was able to live with such blameless character in a very wicked time?

What parallel can you draw from how Noah lived that can motivate you to live a godly life?

In II Peter 2:5 Noah is described as a preacher of righteousness. What does that mean?

2. Scripture also describes others who walked with God (Enoch – Genesis 5:22). What Biblical principles would help you walk with God? (For example, Psalm 119:9, 11; Romans 12:1-2; Galatians 5:16)
3. Genesis 6:22 and 8:20 are two defining traits of Noah's character. What are they and why are they important?
4. How does Noah's example compel you to live in our wicked world?
