

## Adult Impact Questions

If possible, read Genesis 1:3-23 from several translations. For additional insight and study go to [www.studylight.org](http://www.studylight.org).

1. Why believe in a literal six day/24 hour timeframe of creation? Can night and day mean anything else? If so, what else could it mean?

Discuss briefly other theories about how the universe came into existence. (For example: the gap theory, evolution, theistic evolution, day-age theory, ruin-reconstruction theory, etc.) Why does it matter if you believe any one of these theories?

2. If lights in the expanse of the sky weren't created until day 4 in the creation week, what light was created on day 1?
3. Looking over the Biblical account of creation and its order why doesn't evolution or a long day theory make sense? How does the creation order in the Bible differ from the order in evolution?
4. In relationship to time itself, the week establishes what important principle that we continue to operate by today? Why is that important when it comes to creation as a six day/24 hour period?

5. What is meant by the word “kind” in the creation account?
6. In regard to salvation, does it matter whether or not you believe in 6 literal days of creation or in evolution? Defend your answer.
7. If the heavens declare the glory of God, how can you join creation this week in giving praise to God?
