1. Verse 1 begins with, “What shall we say then?” which is a follow up to chapter 5:18-21. Discuss those verses.
2. Do you think believers intentionally “continue in sin that grace may abound”? If not, how does it happen?
3. Once a person puts their faith in the finished work of Christ, he has a new relationship to sin. Explain what that is and why.
4. What is the baptism Paul writes about in verses 3-4?
5. What does Paul mean when he writes of “slaves of sin” and “slaves of righteousness”? In what way are we slaves?
6. What does “dead to sin” mean in the life of the believer?
7. Discuss the idea that members of our body are instruments of unrighteousness/righteousness.
8. Verse 19 speaks of our presenting our members of slaves of righteousness for holiness. How does that work out in our everyday life?
9. We have the life-changing message in Romans 6:23 to share with the lost. How would it help if we were to see them as souls rather than just looking at their outward appearance?
