1. What is the best definition of mercy that you have heard or hold to?
2. In what ways do we experience God's mercy?

God is merciful even when we are not aware of it. Discuss this in light of Genesis 20:1-7.  
How does that relate to the believer?

In times of disobedience or grief, we experience God's mercy. Discuss this in light of  
Psalm 6:2-4. How does that relate to the believer?

God's mercy does not come as a result of our worthiness. Discuss this in light of 2  
Corinthians 5:17.

3. The blind man (perhaps Bartimaeus) was told that "Jesus of Nazareth" was passing by.  
How did he express his faith in Jesus as the Messiah?
4. Why do you think the blind man called out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me"  
rather than, "Jesus, Son of David, take away my blindness, let me see"?
5. Jesus knew about the blind man well before he came near to the place where he was  
begging. Do you see any significance in Jesus not approaching the blind man, rather  
ordering that the blind man be brought to him?
6. As He often did, we find Jesus asking a question. Why did He ask the blind man what he  
wanted to be done for him? He could see that he was blind.
7. What three things happened when Jesus said, "Receive your sight, your faith has healed  
you"?
8. List some ways can you show God's mercy to others in your words and actions?
