A Boaulé proverb from Cote d'Ivoire [West Africa] says, *KeTi wolε, nangluman wlaman kle*, meaning, “When the head is present, the knee does not wear the hat.” The head is at the top of the body, and so it receives the honor of the hat. David was well aware that God was truly king . . . his actions and words reflected his reverence for God.¹
Let David’s song of praise and thanksgiving guide us in that regard as we consider today’s passage.

1. It is often said that the Bible is its own best commentary.

Psalm 105:1-15 is the basis for 1 Chronicles 16:8-22. Compare the two and see what you find that gives additional meaning or understanding to today’s passage.

Psalm 96:1-15 is the basis for 1 Chronicles 16: 23-34. Compare the two and see what you find that gives additional meaning or understanding to today’s passage.

Psalm 106:1,47-48 is the basis for 1 Chronicles 16:34-36. Compare the two and see what you find that gives additional meaning or understanding to today’s passage.

2. In verses 8, 9, 23, and 24 we read, “Make known His deeds among the peoples...Talk of all His wondrous works...Proclaim the good news of His salvation from day to day...Declare His glory among the nations, His wonders among all peoples.”

What deeds, works, good news, and wonders of the Lord would the children of Israel have made known or talked about?

What deeds, works, good news, and wonders of the Lord do we have to make known and talk about that the children of Israel had not experienced or known about?

3. As you read our passage what things did you find for which we need to thank the Lord?
