## Adult Impact Study Sheet – February 25, 2024

Read **Psalm 14:1-7**; if possible from several translations. For additional insight go to www.studylight.org and www.gotquestions.org.

- 1. Having read Psalm 14, now take a few moments to read Psalm 53 which seems to be, for the most part, a duplicate of Psalm 14. Why do you think David repeats what he has already written?
- 2. "In the Hebrew language, there are three basic words for fool: kesyl, the dull stupid fool; ewiyl, the unreasonable and perverted fool; and nabal the brutish person who is like a stubborn animal.<sup>1</sup>" *Nabal* is the word used in Psalm 14:1.
  - "The *nabal* fool has a moral problem in the heart, not a mental problem in the head.<sup>2</sup>" Discuss Wiersbe's statement.
- 3. What is the difference between a true atheist and an atheist wannabe?
- 4. Discuss the difference in the outlook of
  - the atheist (the one who denies God's existence
  - the one who doesn't care if there's a God
  - the one who doesn't know if there's a God
- 5. Why does atheism lead to corruption and wickedness? (See Psalm 36:1-4.)
- 6. "We become atheists in practice when we rely more on ourselves than on God.3" Discuss that statement.
- 7. Discuss what it means in verse 3, "There is none that does good, no, not one." (See also Eccl. 7:20; Romans 3:10-12; Isaiah 53:6.)
- 8. In the face of the corruption and wickedness resulting from atheism, God is the refuge for those who trust in Him. Talk about how that plays out in our world today.
- 9. David faces the reality of the present by looking to the future. Talk about how that should affect our daily lives today.
