- 2. Read verse 4. God judges us very much by the desire of our hearts.² What does Spurgeon mean by that?
- 3. If you were to state your one desire, that one thing you would ask from the Lord, what would it be?
- 4. Read verse 12. What are the adversaries of the soul?
- 5. Read verse 14. To wait for the Lord is to demonstrate confident expectation. To hope in God is to wait for His timing and His action.³ (Psalm 40:1, Isaiah 40:31) Discuss that.
- 6. Still in v. 14. Throughout the Bible people are encouraged to "be strong and courageous." Look up the following passages and determine the settings and who the encourager and the encouraged are.

Joshua 1:5-9, 17-18

Joshua 10:25

Samuel 10:12

1 Chronicles 22:13; 28:20
2 Chronicles 32:6-8
1 Corinthians 16:13-14
