

Adult Impact Study Sheet – September 29, 2024

Read **Psalm 145:1-21**, if possible, from several translations.

1. The psalmist says in verse 2 that he will praise the Lord every day. On a sheet of paper list 1 thing for each day of the month.
2. Discuss from verse 3 what it means that no one can fathom God's greatness.

Discuss other verses that speak about the depth of God's greatness? (For example, see Jeremiah 10:6; I Chronicles 16:25; I Chronicles 29:11 and Romans 11:33-36)

3. According to verses 4-7 what is our responsibility to the succeeding generation and what should be the result?
4. From verses 8-9 discuss what it means that "the Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love...[and] good to all."

What evidence do we see of these attributes of God in Scripture?

How are God's attributes evident today?

Looking at verses 10-12, what then should be our response to this evidence?

5. How does verse 13 speak to God's sovereign rule and what that does that mean for the nations even today?
6. Verse 13 also speaks about God's faithfulness. Discuss that with verses like Lamentations 3:22-23. Cite other verses that speak of God's faithfulness.
7. What promises are given in verses 13-20? How do those apply to you?
