4. **The Call to Macedonia:** What does the Macedonian man's plea for help reveal about the needs of people today? How can we respond to similar calls in our communities? Acts 16:9-10
5. **The Role of Prayer in Evangelism:** How does Lydia's conversion demonstrate the importance of prayer in evangelism? What steps can we take to cultivate prayer in our outreach efforts? Acts 16:13, 16
6. **The impact of Joyful Worship:** How did Paul and Silas's singing and praying in prison influence those around them? What role does worship play in our own testimonies? Acts 16:25-32
7. **The Jailer's Transformation:** Why was the jailer's immediate response to ask, "What must I do to be saved" significant? What does this suggest about the effectiveness of witnessing through actions? Acts 16:33-34
8. **The Significance of Civil Rights:** What is the importance of Paul asserting his rights as a Roman citizen? How can we advocate for justice while remaining faithful to our mission? Acts 1:35-39
